No other film adaptation of an Austen novel was made for theatrical release until 1995. Amazingly, during 1995 and 1996, six film and television adaptations appeared, first *Clueless*, then *Persuasion*, followed by *Pride and Prejudice*, *Sense and Sensibility*, the Miramax *Emma*, and the Meridian/A&E *Emma*.
