During her time in captivity, at the age of fourteen and seventeen, she gave birth to two daughters, both fathered by Garrido. In her stark, utterly honest and unflinching narrative, Jaycee opens up about what she experienced, including how she feels now, a year after being found. Garrido and his wife Nancy have since pleaded guilty to their crimes.
